2024 was a successful year for Freedom Barks, Inc. in large part due to the continued generosity of our field sponsors. With their support, Freedom Barks, Inc., can afford to have the park's dog waste receptacles serviced weekly by Big Business Scoopers, which is essential for the maintenance of Freedom Barks Dog Park.



As part of our year-round volunteer efforts, we stocked the waste bag stations and hosted two Respect Your Park Day events where volunteers worked in stewardship of the park. Our clean-up day to-do lists consisted of the following: picking up litter, filling in holes, repairing bridges, trimming along the trails, and creating brush piles for Public Works to remove. Volunteers also dedicated time to the following improvement projects: refurbishing all seventeen of the trail signs, rebuilding the small A-frame, re-painting the agility equipment, and rebuilding Zallie's Bridge on Shiloh Trail.


